9:00AM – noon

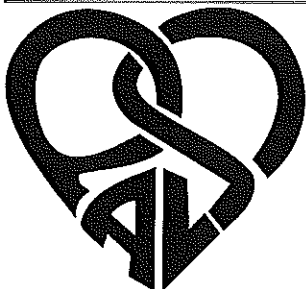
