

Sarasota Suncoast Academy

The governing body of Suncoast Academy will be the Board of Directors and will serve as the School Advisory Council (SAC). The Board of Directors will oversee the management, operations, activities and affairs of the school. The Board of Directors will be accountable to Sarasota County School Board and to the Florida Department of Education. The Board of Directors will establish, approve and determine the boundaries of policy to ensure compliance with Suncoast Academy's charter, applicable laws, rules and regulations. The Board of Directors shall monitor the implementation of the goals of Suncoast Academy. This board will also have responsibility for expenditures.

The Board of Directors shall meet quarterly at Suncoast Academy. The date and time of the meeting will be posted on the school website. The proposed agenda shall be available to any parties upon request.

The Board shall set policy for the school. The Principal shall have discretion on how to implement the policy set by the Board. The Board of Directors shall not be involved in the day-to-day operations of Suncoast Academy. The Board of Directors shall not supervise teachers or staff. The Principal shall supervise and evaluate teachers and staff.

Sarasota Suncoast Academy will be a public employer.

The Board of Directors shall develop policies related to but not limited to the recruitment, registration, dismissal procedures, school activities, curriculum, business/accounting services, student expectations/achievement, faculty and staff selection and evaluation of students, staff, and administration. Further, the Board shall establish evaluation criteria to verify established policies have been implemented. The Principal shall have the discretion to decide how the established policies shall be implemented.
