	Details	Both school sites have coordinated with facilities and designated an area where ill children can be kept and safely supervised by their staff while awaiting pick-up. Staff who are supervising this area will don PPE (gloves, gown, face shield, mask).
	Task	Prevention of Spread: Face Coverings for Children 2 years of age and older

	Details	The School Board Face Mask Emergency Policy 2020-2 indicates that students 2 years of age and older wear a cloth face covering while at school. Reference Emergency Face Mask Emergency Policy 2020-2.

	Details	Playgrounds: High touch areas will be sanitized after each class use by CYESIS childcare staff. CYESIS children will only be present at the playground with their cohort group of children. Both CYESIS sites will create a system where staff and whenever possible, children remove their street shoes upon entering the building – particularly from the playground. A pair of “school shoes” should be stored in the Center for daily wear or the soles of the children’s shoes will be wiped with an approved cleaning agent.

	Details	Remove all soft items including dress up clothing and items that need to be laundered in order to be properly cleaned and disinfected. Wherever possible carpeting will be removed, replaced or covered with vinyl matting. Children bedding will be kept separate and stored in individually labeled bins, cubbies or bags.
		In cases where the carpet cannot be removed, staff will follow CDC protocols for cleaning the carpet. (Custodial staff will vacuum after every day, carpet cleaning will occur weekly by custodial staff.) https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/community/disinfecting-building-facility.html
	Task	Prevention of Spread: Items brought into the facility.

	Details	Children and families will not bring items to and from the center on a daily basis. Items needed for each child will be brought in on Monday, will remain on campus for the week. These will be returned home with the child on Friday. No backpacks will be allowed. All items needed for children will be transported in disposable plastic bags. Only essential staff personal items will be allowed in the facilities. These will be placed in a designated area that is secure.

	Resource	Consensus of CYESIS Re-opening Committee
	Details	Purchase vinyl boppies (easy to disinfect and sanitize). If cloth boppies are used, each baby can have their own boppies (labeled with child's name and washed daily) Each baby will have their individual soft and plastic toys to use and will sanitize after use. For older Toddlers: We will use individual pencil boxes that can be disinfected easily for each child (crayons, markers). Paper will be kept in the classroom cabinet and staff will take it out as needed for children to use. Staff will use 4-step sanitizing/disinfecting procedures. Staff will hold and feed babies. Staff will talk, hold and interact with babies/children and provide a safe, healthy, and nurturing environment.

		<p>Staff will follow step-by-step diapering changing procedures.</p> <p>We will use vinyl bibs that staff can disinfect and sanitize easily. If cloth bibs are used, each child will have their own designated bib.</p> <p>During nap time children will be apart 6ft: This does not apply if there is a barrier (Shelf). For shelves with holes as a backing, laminating paper will be used to close the holes.</p> <p>We will ensure head to toe/toe to head cot / crib placements.</p> <p>Board books for babies and will sanitized after each use.</p> <p>When possible, we will laminate books for easy sanitization.</p> <p>Books that are laminated will be available on the book shelves.</p> <p>Were possible, children will have their own individual sets of items and not share art supplies/books if possible.</p> <p>We will use individual bins for each child, labeled with each child’s name. (Books that can’t be laminated will be placed here.)</p> <p>We will replace carpets with vinyl mats for the baby areas and learning areas.</p> <p>Each classroom will be equipped with a container with lid to put dirty toys mouthed by children to be sanitized-</p> <p>The container will be labeled <i>Dirty Toys</i></p>

	Details	<p><u>BLOCK AREA</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Will use: ➤ Wood blocks ➤ Plastic blocks ➤ Plastic cars and trucks ➤ Plastic community workers/people ➤ Carpets will be removed-Need to purchase a vinyl flat mat or interlocking foam mat <p><u>LIBRARY AREA</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Materials will not be shared ➤ Board Books

- Scarves will be kept away from Children reach. Staff will bring out and use and wash after each use.

Dramatic Play Area

- Materials will not be shared
- Plastic baby dolls
- Vinyl Clothes

OUTDOOR/PLAYGROUND TIME

- Children will change to house shoes if they have a second set of shoes or their schools will be wiped down with appropriate cleaners when they go to the playground

	Details	<p>Remove shared sensory items such as play dough, finger paint etc.</p> <p>Purchase additional sensory tables.</p> <p>Cease use of all group sensory/water tables.</p> <p>Instead, provide individual sensory experiences with individual materials for each child which are then cleaned and sanitized immediately after use.</p>

	Details	<p>Staff who work directly with children will be provided scrubs. Tops will have buttons or snaps, so staff do not need to pull them over their heads. These scrubs will be donned upon arrival to the workspace and doffed upon the end of his/her shift. Children First, Inc, has agreed to provide this resource to all CYESIS staff that work directly with children.</p> <p>Scrubs will be washed and dried daily. A staff member will be designated to launder scrubs at each site.</p> <p>Classroom staff will be provided reimbursement of up to \$50.00 for the purchase of shoes to be worn in the classrooms. Children First, Inc. has agreed to provide this resource to all CYESIS staff that work directly with children.</p> <p>Paper booties in each classroom for visitors (Family Advocates and Managers) wearing street shoes. Children First, Inc. has agreed to provide this resource to all CYESIS staff that work directly with children.</p> <p>Classroom staff will change shoes or don booties when traveling into hallways or common areas. This protocol is in place to ensure that classroom floors remain free of contagion.</p>

	Details	Washing, Feeding, or Holding a Child:

CHILD HEALTH		<p>It is important to comfort crying, sad, and/or anxious infants and toddlers, and they often need to be held. To the extent possible, when washing, feeding, or holding very young children: Child care providers can protect themselves by wearing scrubs provided by the agency and by wearing long hair up off the collar in a ponytail or other updo.</p> <p>Childcare providers should wash their hands, neck, and anywhere touched by a child’s secretions.</p> <p>Childcare providers should change the child’s clothes if secretions are on the child’s clothes. They should change the button-down shirt, if there are secretions on it, and wash their hands again.</p> <p>Contaminated clothes will be placed in a plastic bag or washed in a washing machine.</p> <p>Infants, toddlers, and their providers should have multiple changes of clothes on hand in the childcare center or home-based childcare.</p> <p>Childcare providers will wash their hands before and after handling infant bottles prepared at home or prepared in the facility. Bottles, bottle caps, nipples, and other equipment used for bottle-feeding will be thoroughly cleaned after each use by washing in a dishwasher or by washing with a bottlebrush, soap, and water.</p>

Details	<p>Morning Arrival:</p> <p>Recognizing that generally babies often become ill and cannot communicate yet that they may have a high temperature, coupled with the fact that children under two will not be wearing masks, our CYESIS programs will ensure that all babies upon arrival to school will have their temperatures checked and recorded following the procedures below. Should a baby have a temperature at or above 100.4⁰F (38⁰C), and the baby and parent need district-sponsored transportation, school staff will coordinate district approved transportation with the district’s Transportation Department.</p>	

		<p>Staff will conduct temperature screening (follow steps below)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Perform hand hygiene - Wash your hands with soap and water for 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use a hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. • Put on disposable gloves. • Check the child’s temperature, reaching around the partition or through the window. • Make sure your face stays behind the barrier at all times during the screening. • If performing a temperature check on multiple individuals, ensure that you use a clean pair of gloves for each child and that the thermometer has been thoroughly cleaned in between each check. • If you use disposable or non-contact (temporal) thermometers and you did not have physical contact with the child, you do not need to change gloves before the next check. • If you use non-contact thermometers, clean them with an alcohol wipe (or isopropyl alcohol on a cotton swab) between each client. You can reuse the same wipe as long as it remains wet. <p>Any child with a temperature of 100.4⁰F (38⁰C) or above will need to return home.</p> <p>Staff will make a visual inspection of the child for signs of illness, which could include flushed cheeks, rapid breathing or difficulty breathing (without recent physical activity), fatigue, or extreme fussiness.</p>

	Details	<p>Implement social distancing strategies. Ensure the same children remain in the same group each day.</p> <p>Keep groups together throughout the day and whenever possible do not combine groups in the mornings or afternoon.</p>

	Details	Maintain an adequate ratio of staff to children to ensure safety; ensure groups are 10 or fewer (inclusive of child care providers).

Details	Ensure that the children’s naptime mats (or cribs) are spaced out as much as possible, ideally 6 feet apart. Place children head to toe in order to further reduce the potential for viral spread. (See Classroom Practices)

	Details	Children who come to the child-care center sick will follow the specific guidance for all children within the SCS Re-Opening Guidance Plan If there is a confirmed case of contagious illness, a health alert will be posted on the classroom door for parents/guardians. <i>M:\Forms - HS-EHS\Early Child Dev\Health\Health Alerts</i>
	Task	Alternative to family style meals

	Details	If meals are typically served family-style, plate each child’s meal to serve it so that multiple children are not using the same serving utensils. Meals will be served either pre-plated or served out by a staff member who does not diaper children. There will be one designated staff person to diaper children, so the other can assist with meal service. Children will have their own individually labeled cup, plate, bowl, & utensils that will be used for each meal Alternatively, paper/plastic ware will be used. Staff will wash hands and use gloves before plating; Children and providers will wash hands prior to and after meal service.
