Consent Agenda Highlights – #17 "Agreement Between Owner and Construction Manager for Construction"



The School Board approved the Preconstruction Agreement for this project (the Sarasota High School Buildings 13 & 14 Renovation Project: Phase 1) on 10/18/22 and design and constructability proceeded.

- Schematics and Design Development Documents were priced.
- The process of preparing the Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) has begun.
- This contract will allow work to commence early and proceed seamlessly while GMP is being finalized.
- Preparing the contract for early release items will allow the team to move forward with important reconstruction duties.
- A budget has been created and early release will not change the total project budget.



Pine View Earned Platinum Recognition on the 2023 AP Honor Roll





Congratulations to Pine View School for being recognized at the Platinum level on the 2023 Advanced Placement (AP) School Honor Roll by the College Board!

Pine View is being recognized on the Platinum level because the Class of 2024 met or exceeded the College Board's Platinum criteria:

- 1. 80% experiencing 1 AP course before graduating.
- 2. 50% earning college credit by earning an AP Exam score of 3.
- **15%** taking a total of 5 AP courses across their high school years; with at least 1 taken in their 9th or 10th grade year.
