Consent Agenda Highlights – #8 Approval of the 2023-2025 Local Articulation Agreement with the State College of Florida



Description:

Through collaboration, the State College of Florida, Manatee County Schools, and Sarasota County Schools agree to provide at no cost to eligible students, SCF college credit for the Associate in Science (AS) Degree/Certificate programs for earned credits and industry certifications as listed in the agreement.

Gap Analysis:

This agreement allows students to earn college credit for successful completion of specific courses and certifications.

Previous Outcomes:

This agreement is evaluated, updated, and renewed every three years.

Expected Outcomes:

This agreement will continue to offer SCF college credit to students who successfully complete courses and certifications as listed in the agreement.

Recommendation:

That the 2023-2025 Local Articulation Agreement Renewal with the State College of Florida be approved as presented.

Description:

This agreement provides training and opportunities for Sarasota County High School students to develop leadership skills.

Gap Analysis:

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Sarasota and DeSoto Counties, Inc. provide training programs for students interested in developing leadership skills.

Previous Outcomes:

In the past, the Superintendent's Student Advisory Council has engaged with the Superintendent and district administrators in suggesting changes to district policy. This occurs at a yearly forum with the students.

Expected Outcomes:

Some of the ideas from the students are often implemented in the school district.

Recommendation:

That the agreement between the Boys & Girls Clubs of Sarasota and DeSoto Counties, Inc. be approved as presented.




Englewood SRO Awarded the "School Based Difference Maker" Award
