What is Title I

Title I is program funded by the federal government to improve students' academic achievement. Money is given to school districts to help children meet the Florida's Next Generation Sunshine State Standards. The amount of money given to each school depends on the number of low-income families enrolled in the school.

How is Title I implemented

Title I programs are implemented either schoolwide or as targeted programs. Both programs use effective methods and instructional strategies based on scientifically based research to assist students in reaching proficiency on Florida's Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT). In a schoolwide program all students receive supplemental support from the Title I program. A targeted assistance program provides assistance for the students who have the greatest academic need.

Reading Grades 3-5: 82% of our students achieved a level 3 or above

Math 3-5: 79% of our students achieved a level 3 or above

Writing 4: 73% of our students achieved a level 3 or above
