REMINDER SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

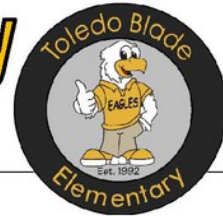

- **Top Color Choices: Solid or Logo Polo Tops in Black, White, or Gold**
- **Bottom Color Choices: Black or Khaki**

Student Uniform Policy

Mandatory for ALL Students PreK-Grade 5



Tops: Collared Polos, Dresses, Sweaters, Jackets	Top Colors: Gold, White, and Black <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Short or long-sleeved collared polo shirts • Solid uniform color, <u>with or without logo</u> • No button up shirts authorized • Sweaters, sweatshirts, jackets & layered items must be in solid uniform color <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Optional:</u></p> <p>Logo uniform polo shirts can be ordered online or at Toledo Blade Elementary. The cost is \$15.00 each. Logo sweatshirts & jackets are also available for order at various times during the year.</p>
Bottoms: Shorts, Pants, Capris, Skirts, Skorts, Jumpers	Bottom Colors: Khaki and Black <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bottoms must be to mid-thigh with an inseam of 6 inches or more • Shorts are expected to be worn under skirts • Leggings (khaki or black only) can be worn <u>under</u> bottoms • Leggings/jeggings/excessively tight bottoms may not be worn alone • Athletic/workout shorts and sweatpants are not allowed (Solid blue jeans allowed ONLY on school SPIRIT Days)
Shoes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closed toed/Fully enclosed shoes with a sole required. • Must be tied or closed with Velcro straps • Sneakers required on PE day(s) and for recess participation
Socks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Required - Solid uniform colors "preferred"
School Spirit Days	<p>"Last School Day of the Week"</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Solid blue jeans/denim and any TBES polo/spirit t-shirts are optional
Free Days	<p>To be announced by administration</p>
Picture Days	<p>For Class Picture Days: Full uniform required Individual Picture Days: Students may dress out of uniform, but in full compliance with dress code expectations</p>
Field Trips	<p>Full uniform required on all field trips unless approved by administration</p>
Enforcement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1st Offense: Call, note home & change into uniform attire • 2nd Offense: Call, note home & change into uniform attire • After 5 days of non-compliance: Letter mailed to the home and administrative team intervention
Scholarships	<p>Applications for assistance are available from the Guidance Department and are subject to approval (verification of eligibility required)</p>

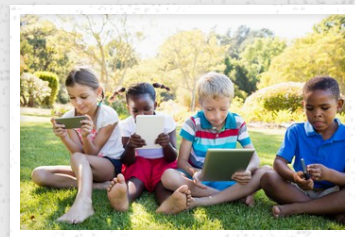
Reflect on the School Year with Your Child & Celebrate Success!

As the school year winds down, it's a good time to help your child look back, look forward, give thanks and celebrate.

Here's how:

- **Talk to your child's teacher.** Get his/her thoughts on your child's strengths and weaknesses. How has he/she improved? Where does he/she need more work? Ask what you can do to help your child over the summer.
- **Talk to your child about the school year.** Ask what he/she thinks went well. Help him/her figure out what changes he/she should make next year.
- **Review your child's successes.** Look over the schoolwork you've saved during the year. Point out how much he/she has learned - how many new words for example. Or how he/she can add and divide. Or how his/her writing has improved.
- **Help your child list learning goals for the summer.** Guide him/her based on suggestions from his/her teacher.
- **Encourage your child to thank those who have made the year a good one.** The teacher, bus driver, food service worker, etc. This will help him/her appreciate how many people have helped him/her.
- **Celebrate with a special activity and enjoy some one-on-one time with your child.**

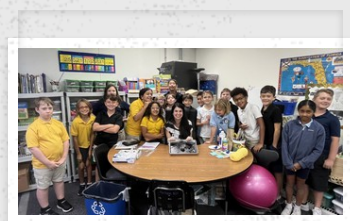


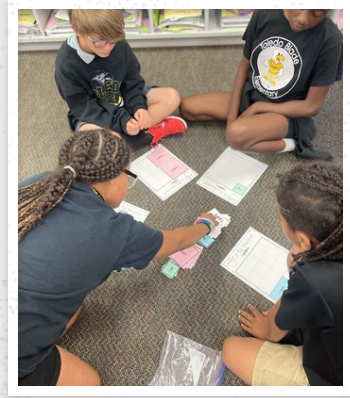
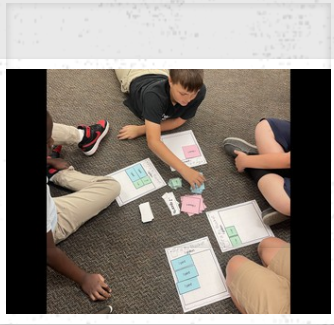
The lazy days of summer can often lead to lazy hours in front of the TV, computer, and other electronic devices. For most families, that's easier said than done! But experts say it's important to limit recreational screen time – even in the summer.

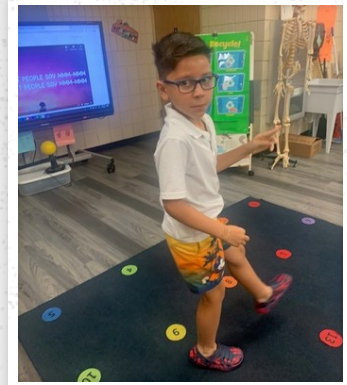
Replace screen time with activities such as:

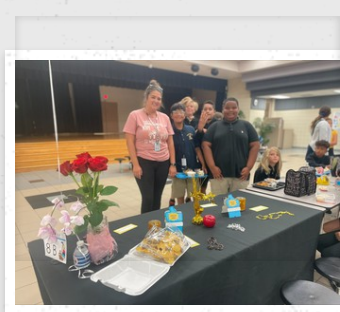
- **Acting.** Instead of watching a show, your child can create one! They can choose a storyline and act it out with friends or stuffed animals.
- **Classic Games.** Fill a bucket with traditional summer toys, including sidewalk chalk, balls, bubble stuff, and water sprayers. When the weather is right, your child can take it outside for hours of fun.
- **Scavenger hunts.** Give educational instructions, such as, "Let's find an oak tree leaf." Or, "Find three things that are round." Remember, you can have a scavenger hunt anywhere, even in a store or on vacation.
- **Focus on your child's interests.** Ask Them if there is something they would like to learn more about during school break. Maybe they want to identify stars and constellations at night or learn how to camp. Help them find books about subjects they love.
- **Be creative.** Remember that all kinds of reading materials can help your child maintain and build skills – comic books, craft magazines, and even cookbooks.

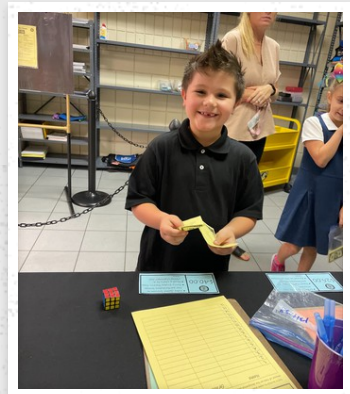
