## Message from our Behavior Specialist - Ms. Zoppo

Dear SMS Families,

So many students are doing a GREAT job of wearing their badges on lanyards each day! We are so proud of them. PLEASE HELP US ENCOURAGE STUDENTS TO KEEP UP THE GOOD WORK AND WEAR THEIR ID BADGES TO SCHOOL EVERY DAY! Students wearing their badges every day are being awarded panther paws, which they can use to enter weekly raffles during lunches for various rewards like gift cards, donuts, candy, etc.

As a reminder, the following is a slide we shared with students regarding ID badge requirements during grade level forums held over the first week of school:



- Students are REQUIRED TO WEAR ID BADGES.
  - VISIBLE & WORN AT ALL TIMES
    - Example: worn on a lanyard around the neck, an ID Holder clipped to their belt loop
    - DO NOT: keep ID attached to your backpack, lulu bag, etc.
- Students cannot alter the ID badge (cover up picture, write on it, etc.)
- Students are <u>responsible for their own badge</u> (consequences will be issued for stealing badges)
- Consequences for Non-compliance with ID Badge Requirements:
  - 1st offense: warning & notice of concern
  - $-\frac{2^{nd}}{n}$  offense: notice of concern, lunch detention, phone call home
  - $-3^{rd}$  offense: notice of concern, lunch detention, \$5 charge for new badge, call home
  - After 3<sup>rd</sup> offense: referral with consequences that correspond to offense
