So proud of how hard these kiddos have worked on learning policies and procedures. Our first unit of reading block focused on living things. Our classrooms have been filled with all kinds of living things such as tadpoles, butterflies, fish aquariums, hamsters, and plants. Such a great way to begin the school year to have students so engaged with learning.

We are really looking forward to the second quarter. We will be focusing on communities which begin this quarter. We are scheduling a career day for students to dress up as what they want to be when they grow up. Details will be coming. We are also looking forward to our Polar Express Day when children are transported to the North Pole to listen to the fantasy story of the Polar Express. We look forward to a wonderful year ahead.

In the Cambridge class, they have been investigating why soil is so important. Students read about soil and the Earth's surface. The 1st term has flown by, where has them time gone?

On reflection, we have learned so much and had lots of fun on the journey.

In ELA we have learned how to identify the main idea of a passage and locate the supporting details in the passage that help us identify the main idea. We learned all about text features such as headings, subheadings, pictures, maps, captions and many more. We've learned how these features in a text give us a better/deeper understanding of what we are reading. Recently we have begun reading folktales and examining the challenges characters face and identifying the theme or lesson of a story.

In writing we began by developing our expository essay writing. We did research on different topics, collected information, organized the information into paragraphs and then wrote an essay on different topics from animals, habitats and apples. Recently we have begun writing an opinion essays. We all have enjoyed expressing our opinions on different topics from more recess time to no homework!

During the 1st term in Math we have focused on developing a strong number sense or foundation by learning different ways to represent numbers. We've have reviewed place value and learned how to decompose number in different way. We have also strengthened our addition & subtraction fluency by learning different strategies to add & subtract such as using a number line to count on & count back. Be explored how to make a 10 to help us add & subtract mentally and we've explored the strategy of making doubles 7+7=14 and near doubles 7+8=15 to add fluently.

We can't wait to learn about our community and or Government in term 2 and all the fun activities we will be doing.

#### **CLASSROOM NEWS**

We finished off the 1st quarter with a fabulous day outside celebrating the awesome behaviors displayed throughout the first 9 weeks. Now we are ready to race forward into Quarter 2! We have an exciting field trip to Bay Preserve in Osprey planned, where students will learn and connect experiences to our upcoming studies in science.

Our focus in science will be Earth Systems and Patterns. The students will learn about the water cycle, weather, types of precipitation, climate zones, and ecosystems.

In math, students will wrap up working with multiplying and dividing decimals. They will then zoom into becoming experts at number sense and whole number dividing will round out the 2nd quarter.

Reading will race students through a range of fictional texts. Their studies will focus on author's point of view and how that can drastically change the events in a story. Some classes will be completing a read aloud using Esperanza Rising, while others will focus on the novel Woods Runner.

Meanwhile, the topic in social studies will include discussions about The American Revolution and conflicts which have shaped our nation

As you can see, we are working extremely hard on our academics in 5th Grade, but also always work in a little fun with the kiddos. We strive to make their last year in elementary the best one yet!

#### **COLDS, FLU, VIRUSES**


Hand washing has long been overlooked as the best means of preventing the spread of coughs, colds and many other ailments. It is the simplest and most cost-effective way to prevent the spread of germs and viruses. Coming in a close second is Hand Sanitizer.

Also, the simple act of properly covering your mouth when you sneeze, or cough will help in slowing down the spread of germs. It has been drilled into us since we where little to cover our mouths when we sneeze or cough. But we where never taught how to do that correctly... Use the BACK of your hand to cover your coughs and sneezes. You can also cough or sneeze into your elbow/sleeve. This prevents the germs from spreading to the items that we touch.

Another very simple and effective method of NOT spreading germs, DO NOT put your fingers in your eyes, nose or mouth. This area is referred to as the "T" zone of the body. If they can't get in, they can't make you sick.

## SPOTLIGHT ON SPECIALS

#### Music

Performing Arts-In Performing Arts, we are learning about the elements of musical theatre and responding to a musical theatre performance this rotation.

Art- For the second quarter, we will be learning about nature and science along with art in art class! Students will be discussing why leaves change color in the fall and the structure of a tree. Then, students will use various materials to make a project that includes a tree. After that, we will be learning about what causes arouras near the North and South poles. Students will use pastels to create their own aroura art works.

#### Science

STEM fair is here!!! 5th graders are working on their own STEM fair projects at home going through the scientific process. Students will turn in their logbooks before Thanksgiving break. Teachers will review and grade logbooks looking for their classes best projects. Administration will select the best projects to send to the county STEM fair. Younger grade levels are working on collecting data in data tables and making observations of different matter and comparing their properties.

#### **Technology**

In Technology, we will be creating PowerPoints. K-2 will be making a PowerPoint about animals. 3-5 students are making a PowerPoint about The Scientific Method with Paper Airplanes. The students in 3-5 have done this experiment and filled out their log books with Ms. Dehart in STEM. They will use their data to create their PowerPoint. Afterwards, we will be working on coding using Minecraft Code/Code.org.

#### **Global Perspectives (GPS)**

Anti-Bullying- We will be discussing what is a bully? and ways to stop a Bully. Special guests for this presentation are Officer Roy, Mrs. Jenkins and Mrs. Hughes Empathy- We will be discussing what is empathy? How we show empathy to others. Cambridge Citizenship-We will talk about people in the community. Ways we can help our home, school, and community.

#### PE

In quarter 2, we will be promoting opportunities to develop a variety of gross motor skills, whilst embedding teamwork, empathy and collaborative communication through competitive games.



Our 5th grade safety patrols are seen all around campus assigned to numerous duties that include Morning Arrival, Hallways Monitoring, After Dismissal in the Cafe or Kindergarten hallway, Bus loop and the Honor Guard, Who raise the flag every morning. However, this not just a safety patrol duty. This is a Team of students who work together daily to help maintain and promote our school R.O.A.R.S. expectations. These students are becoming creative leaders while building everlasting friendships.

Our safety patrol team currently consists of 37 students: 22 safety patrols, 6 safety patrol sergeants, 2 safety patrol captains, and 7 honor guards. Each month they can be selected for promotions and for the honor guard. Promotions are not given, but earned, and our patrollers are doing a great job of earning promotions.

Finally, our safety patrol program is expanding to after school duties, called the Lions Honor Team. This is a ceremonial team where students will learn customs and traditions of marching and parade events while taking pride in our school, the program and most importantly ourselves while developing successful leadership skills.

### All Pro Dad - Family Engagement

The Lamarque All Pro Dad family engagement program is still growing strong and expanding by the day. With valued input from families, the All-Pro Dads events are hosted on the third Thursday of each month while offering different times for each month including breakfast, lunch, and dinner.


