Second graders are racing into school and up the stairs to the second floor with the upper elementary classes. With the move up to second, there comes more responsibility and accountability.

This year we will focus on developing our metal math strategies so that we can move into three digit mathematical problems along with 2 step word problems.

In ELA, we are working on developing and strengthening independent reading skills by focusing on chunking parts of words to decode instead of sounding out each letter and reading for understanding.

n writing we will use a deeper understanding of what we read to become better writers.

In second grade we will focus on writing expository and opinion pieces of writing that are 2-5 paragraphs in length by the end of the year.

We have some exciting topics in science this year. We will begin with introducing the scientific process and the process of doing science investigations. Through the year we will also investigate Earth surfaces, different forms of energy, changing matter, part of the human body, and animals and their habitats.



Lamarque Elementary Student Uniform Policy

For ALL Students PreK—5th Grade
Short or long-sleeved collared polo style shirts with or without logo. Shirt Colors: Solid navy, gold, white, hunter green, maroon, light pink, light blue These are available at local retailers or through the school Bookkeeper (Lamarque Logoed). Not Allowed: shirts with zippers/stripes/designs/or product emblems
Bottom Colors: Navy/Khaki/Black Bottoms should be mid-thigh to knee length. Solid colored belts should be worn with loose-fitting bottoms. Not Allowed: sweat pants, denim, pants with stripes/designs/or emblems, athletic (basketball style) shorts
Solid uniform colors Boys: white, navy or black socks Not Allowed: decorative socks, mismatched socks
Sneakers or tennis shoes with laces or Velcro that covers the top of the foot. Not Allowed: boots, sandals, flip-flops, heels, crocs, open-toed shoes, wheelie shoes, loafers, deck shoes, Sperries, HeyDudes **Students wearing shoes other than sneakers or tennis shoes will NOT be able to participate in PE or recess activities.
Jackets and sweatshirts—in solid colors—may be worn, but the uniform polo must be worn underneath. During cold weather, girls may wear solid uniform-colored leggings with skirts, skorts, shorts, and jumpers. Leggings /stretch pants should not be worn as pants in isolation.
Lamarque Spirit shirts are <i>HIGHLY</i> encouraged. These include Pride-a-Thon shirts or the Lamarque Jersey. Jeans are allowed (no rips/tears/holes above the knee). Regular uniform is also appropriate. Spirit shirts can be purchased through the Bookkeeper.
Hair accessories, hair color and/or hair style should not distract from student learning. Hair must be of natural color.
Caps, hats, hoods must be removed in school buildings during school hours. Not Allowed: Bandanas; Makeup, multiple bangle or gel bracelets, large dangling or hoop earrings or other jewelry that could cause injury or disruption.
Fall Pictures: Uniform is required as this is for the yearbook. Spring Pictures: May dress out of uniform but in full compliance with dress code expectations.
On non-uniform dress days, students must wear appropriate attire. The following are considered "out of dress code" compliance. These items include, but not limited to: halters, tank tops, shirts or dresses with spaghetti straps.
Students not in uniform will be given a clean uniform shirt and/or bottoms to borrow for the day. A notice will be sent home. 1st incident- Written Notice, 2nd incident- Call from Teacher/Admin, 3rd incident- Parent Conference with Administration
Applications for uniform assistance are available in the front office or by contacting Guidance.
Gently used uniform donations are accepted at the front office. Please make sure they are free of rips and stains.
Logoed uniform shirts are available for a fee. They can be purchased online through the Lamarque Webstore or with the school Bookkeeper. https://lamarqueelem.revtrak.net
