Forever Part of Our History

Our very own, Mrs. Daniels, appeared on a CNN News Special on September 11, 2021. Mrs. Daniels was the host teacher to former President George W. Bush on September 11, 2001 at Emma E. Booker Elementary School. The documentary, Front Row to History-The 9/11 Classroom, captured the lives of six of her former students and Mrs. Daniels since that tragic day 9/11. Mrs. Daniels is still teaching 20 years later. Additionally, CNN arranged for Mrs. Daniels and her students to visit the 9/11 Memorial- Ground Zero, in New York.

Unity Day 2021

Students wore orange and blue (Unity Day and anti-bullying colors) on Wednesday Oct 20th, which was recognized as a day to bring attention to how we treat others. Students decorated doors during their Advisory class to display a campus wide message that we are united in treating others with kindness, inclusion, and acceptance. Lastly, students were encouraged to complete a survey that asked them to share times they may have felt bullied or bullied others and what they learned from that experience. Some students indicated it affected their self-confidence. One observed, "I have been made fun of and know how damaging it can be so I avoid doing it as much as possible."





Life Science with Dieter, McCarthy, and Peters

Are zombies alive or not alive? This is the question our seventh graders tackled in our Needs and Characteristics Mini-Unit. Students learned that all living things are made of cells, maintain homeostasis, grow and develop, contain DNA, evolve over time, reproduce, respond to stimuli, and require energy. We looked at items such as pumpkin seeds, fossils, eggs and shells, and even crickets to determine the criteria. Zombies, the students determined, are NOT alive because they don't have all 8 characteristics of life. Students then began the Classification Unit with a jellybean lab, learning about scientific naming and researching an animal's scientific classification (taxonomy). In the meantime, classes are participating in the Carefree Learner, germinating seeds in the classroom, and working in the school garden. More to come in the next newsletter!

Title I Booklet Distribution

What is "Parent's-Right-to-Know"

Federal law requires that the Sarasota County School District notify parents of all children in Title I schools of their rights to receive timely information on the professional qualifications of their child's teacher. Parents may request information about the professional qualifications of the student's classroom teacher including, at a minimum, the following:

- Whether the teacher has met the state qualifications and certification criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which state qualification or certification criteria has been waived.
- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certificate or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications
