Orchestra at EducateSRQ



The VPA Orchestra program was featured in the EducateSRQ Newsletter "Keeping the Love of Learning Alive through EducateSRQ Teacher Grants." In a project, which was called "With All Strings Attached: Teaching Remote Learners Music through Orchestra," Education Foundation of Sarasota County funded the purchase of strings for orchestra instruments (violin, viola, cello) to serve students who were studying music through Orchestra remotely during the 2020-2021 school year. The EducateSRQ Teacher Grant committee read through 239 proposals. The VPA Orchestra program proposal was one of the projects accepted.

Technical Theatre **Engineering Design Challenge**

VPA Technical Theatre students were assigned an Engineering Design Challenge in which they used principals of suspension, load, design, and aesthetics to create a functional, practical, and visually appealing bridge. These principals will be utilized throughout the year as students design and create sets, lighting, costumes, and more for all BMS performances happening this year!


Youth Mental Health Education


Unity Day is October 20th



We've learned about how cells were discovered, the invention of the microscope, the different types of cells that exist, as well as what is found inside of cells. Students have had opportunities to use the digital microscopes to analyze different types of cells. Currently, students are working on cell projects. Cyclone students are working on a project titled "Zombie Apocalypse" in which they are creating a compound to house surviving humans which in turn will be compared to the structure and function of a plant cell. 

Title I Booklet Distribution

What is "Parent's-Right-to-Know"

Federal law requires that the Sarasota County School District notify parents of all children in Title I schools of their rights to receive timely information on the professional qualifications of their child's teacher. Parents may request information about the professional qualifications of the student's classroom teacher including, at a minimum, the following:

- Whether the teacher has met the state qualifications and certification criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which state qualification or certification criteria has been waived.
- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certificate or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications
