
PV DIPLOMA CRITERIA

- Available world language options: Chinese, French, Spanish




WORLD LANGUAGE

Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, high-school credit courses in French and Spanish are renumbered. All students skip a number this year. This renumbering more accurately reflects the rigor of Pine View courses. The renumbering also allows for French 1 and Spanish 1 to be offered as true introductory courses. French 1 and Spanish 1 are now appropriate for students with no background in the language. These courses will cover at an accelerated pace the objectives taught in the respective two-year middle school sequences, Intermediate and Advanced, typically taken at Pine View in grades 6-7. Note that due to a lack of suitable course codes at the state level, the Chinese sequence is not renumbered.
