Pine View Students and Families,

AP Makeup Exams are scheduled for next week **Monday June 1st through Friday June 5th**.

Students taking Makeup Exams will follow the same procedures that were established for the regular AP Exam administration window:

- Students will receive their electronic testing ticket via email AND via their College Board student accounts.
- An approved, updated browser must be used to ensure submissions are received. The College Board system is compatible with Chrome, Safari, Firefox and Edge. The system is **NOT** compatible with Internet Explorer.
- Students must log in to the exam platform 30-minutes prior to the exam start-time.

It is critical that students monitor the passing time during their exam. Students must submit their work during the allotted 5-minute submission period. Submissions sent after the allotted timeframe will not be scored.

We ask families and households once again to work together in support of our testing students. Please make every effort to ensure that students have a quiet, stress-free testing environment, and ask family to pause heavy online activity such as streaming or gaming, during the testing window.

Tips for Makeup AP Exams

Makeup AP Exams ensure that all students still have the chance to pursue college credit and placement, saving tuition and time in college. Below, you'll find tips on how to best prepare for your upcoming exams.

Taking Makeup AP Exams

1. CHECK YOUR MAKEUP EXAM SCHEDULE.

- Makeup exams take place June 1–5. The full schedule is available [here](#).
- If you have two exams at the same time, starting June 1, you can request to take one of them during June 22-30 [exception testing](#).

2. LOCATE YOUR E-TICKET

- Your e-tickets will be emailed to you 2 days before each exam you're taking. [You can confirm your email address here](#).
- The e-ticket will include your AP ID.
- The e-ticket will include the exam start time in EST. Make sure you know what time the exam starts in your respective time zone.

3. WALK THROUGH THE EXAM DAY EXPERIENCE

If you're not familiar with the exam day experience, you should:

- [Start by taking a video tour](#) of the online exams.
- [Review the ways to submit](#) exam responses.
- [Launch an interactive exam demo](#) and practice submitting online.

4. COMPLETE THE EXAM DAY CHECKLIST

On exam day, you should have a copy of your exam day checklist readily available. Starting now, you should:

- [Review course-specific info](#): reference sheets, keyboard guides, and more.

5. CHECK YOUR TECH

- Review these [troubleshooting tips](#) ahead of test day to make sure you're ready to go.

6. REVIEW THE BACKUP SUBMISSION PROCESS

- Although the majority of students have successfully submitted their exams, we have instituted a backup email submission process for browser-based exams. This option will ONLY be available for students who were not able to submit in the standard process—and they must then email their responses immediately following their exam.
- These students will see instructions about how to email their response on the page that says, "We Did Not Receive Your Response." The email address that appears on this page will be unique to each student and exam question. Email submissions are not available for AP Chinese, French, Italian, German, Japanese, or Spanish Language and Culture Exams.

7. CHECK IN 30 MINUTES EARLY ON EXAM DAY

- You should use your e-ticket to check in to your online exam 30 minutes before start time and have your exam day checklist ready.

Please note note that AP Chinese, French, Italian, German, Japanese, or Spanish Language and Culture Exams require that a student download the AP World Languages App. Students should review the exam walk-through video and tech requirements for those exams on [our website](#).
